

Ink Pads

What's the difference?



Dye Ink

Fast drying - dyes the paper (bleeds through) - not suitable for watercolour or embossing - suits light coloured cardstock



Waterproof Dye Ink



Pigment Ink

Slow drying - sits on top of paper - prone to smudging if not heat set - suitable for heat embossing - suits dark coloured cardstock



Chalk Ink

Slow drying - sits on top of paper - permanent when heat set - suits dark coloured cardstock - recommended for planners



Distress Ink

Medium drying time - not suitable for stamping - can bleed through paper - water reactive - blends and layers



Distress Oxide Ink

Fast drying - dye / pigment hybrid ink - suitable for stamping - water reactive - blends and layers - suits light & dark cardstock



Solvent Ink

Fast drying - suits non-porous surfaces (glossy) - permanent - bleeds through paper - NOT for use with Copics



Hybrid Ink

Fast drying - opaque - suits light and dark cardstock



Embossing Ink

Slow drying - suitable for heat embossing - creates watermarks

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Choc-Chip Cookies

Ingredients

- 1 cup Brown Sugar
- 1/2 cup Caster Sugar
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 2 tsp Vanilla Extract
- 2 Eggs
- 160g Butter (soft)
- 2 1/2 cups Self Raising Flour
- 3/4 cup Chocolate Chips

Tools

- Large mixing bowl
- Measuring cups
- Measuring spoons
- Sifter
- Favourite mixing spoon
- Cookie sheet
- Baking paper

Method

- Pre-heat oven to 150°C.
- Into the mixing bowl ...
- Mix brown sugar & caster sugar together.
- Add soft butter and mix.
- Add eggs and mix.
- Add vanilla and mix.
- Sift in flour & salt and mix.
- Add choc chips (add more if you like) and mix.
- Line a cookie sheet with baking paper.
- Place dollops of mixture on the tray, not too close.
- Larger dollops = larger cookies.
- Bake for 18 minutes for a cookie that is a bit chewy.
- Oven temperatures & cooking times may vary, because ovens are weirdly different!

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
